



Percentage of Low-Income Families




More than one in three

Austin Child Poverty is Disproportionate








Child Care Costs More Than College




Parents Often Leave Jobs to Care for Children

One parent not working 62% Both parents working full-time 12% At least one parent working part-time 26%




Our First 5 Years Are Critically Important...

Synapse density over time




New Evidence Shows Early Impact of Stress

School readiness predicts how likely kids are to pass their 3rd Grade STAAR test:


It also predicts:

- Future earning potential


How has COVID-19 Changed Travis County?



Pandemic is Disproportionately Affecting Women

- 22% of all women have left the workforce during the pandemic.
- 42% of women with children under the age of two have left work.
- 41% of women either left the workforce or know a woman who has.

Caregiving demands are a key factor behind these numbers.

Children and parents/caregivers are physically, emotionally, and

Program and Policy

All families receive nurse home visits for newborns, and have access to negative-experience assessments, developmental screenings, and mental health consultations.

Child and Family

The community is aware of the importance of the early years and prioritizes children's development, including providing family-friendly public spaces.

Program and Policy

Civic leaders and organizations adopt, expand, and support policies and investment in high-quality early childhood programs, services, and infrastructure.

Child and Family

Families' basic needs are met, so that parents/caregivers can provide nurturing, responsive care, including talking, singing, and reading to their children every day.

Program and Policy

Families have access to universal connection and referral systems, parent education, home visits, books, and adult education and workforce development.

High-Quality Care & Education

Supported Families

Children's development is fulfilled by responsive, nurturing, and engaging care either in the home, or in a licensed facility, Head Start program, or Pre-K classroom.

Program and Policy

Families have access to high-quality early-learning options that meet their needs, and early childhood educators who are well-prepared and well-paid.
