Young Voices Project

The Young Voices Project engages young people in the theatre process that allows them to explore performance and creative writing. This year, students will perform a unique, devised theatrical piece to the community that celebrates diversity, inclusivity, and identity. Using pre-existing material alongside student-composed monologues and scenes, this performance will focus on celebrating these emerging artists as individuals.

Summer Theatrical Institute 2018

Theatrical Institute: The Actor's Toolbox (Ages 10-17)

The Actor's Toolbox is for the emerging actor, and will expose each student to the foundations of theatre, while developing their interpersonal and performance skills. Coursework includes training in voice (singing and speaking), movement, scene study, audition prep, character study, and other fundamental elements of theatre in a non-competitive atmosphere that fosters artistry and communication. Students will collaborate with professional teaching artists in order to develop skills in these areas and create an original showcase of their work. The program will culminate in a performance open to the public.

Theatrical Institute: Performance Preparation presents *Peter and the Starcatcher* (Ages 10-17)
