Improving Access to Digital Literacy Project



Summary: Supported by OneWorld Foundation, we established digital libraries in Community Primary School Dikenaofeiyi and St Pauls' Primary School, Ezeihe Dikenaofeiyi using solar powered tablets preloaded with educational materials such as ebooks, interactive games, teaching aids and other learning resources.

Objective:


- To bridge the digital divide and increase access to technology and education for 350 primary school children
- To re-enrol 15 out-of-school children through scholarship and provision of school kits



Impact:

- 20% increase in pupil's enrollment into the school recorded
- 511 pupils and 21 teachers have access to digital library using a weekly schedule.
- 15 orphans who dropped out of school due to lack of finances are now back to school thus increase completion rate in the schools.






















Campaign against Female Genital Mutilation Project



Summary:

Using AmplifyChange fund, we built alliance with key influencers to stop the practice of Female Genital Mutilation, a Sexual & Reproductive Health Right (SRHR) and harmful traditional practice secretly still ongoing in 4 communities of Ngor Okpala LGA of Imo State, Nigeria.

Objectives:

- To create awareness on SRHR as a Human Right
- Address major gaps in FGM knowledge including its dangers
- Bring about changes in beliefs, attitudes and values
- Support 4 communities to eliminate the practice of FGM.



Impact:

- Partnership built with 4 Traditional Rulers, 58 key influencers and endFGM rule/sanction introduced in each community
- Change in beliefs, behaviours and attitude towards the practice of FGM achieved with 3,370 villagers reached
- 10 female babies born within the project period were not victims of the practice
- 36 endFGM champions empowered to organize community driven endFGM activities as sustainability strategy

Project Summary:

Sponsored by Age of Wonderland, Netherlands, we conducted a creative learning session initiated to build a community mind-set amongst people of different generations, so they can utilize an engaging activity such as memory photo quilt-making to build multi-level relationship and promote social inclusion to re-engage members of their families or communities who live and study in socially isolated pockets.

Objective:

 to strengthen community spirit of people from different generations through participation in quiltmaking.



Impact:

Publication of the report of the project on social media including the training manual helped people to identify with our goal, provided access to information on the possibility of building multi-level relationship and has encouraged replication of the activity


