FAHCI was established in 2002 by an experienced Public Health Nurse who has over twenty years of community health work in various localities. The organization is a membership organization with seven (7) Board of Directors and five (5) Trustee members. FAHCI is working in Nasarawa, Plateau and Benue State with Lafia being the head office.
