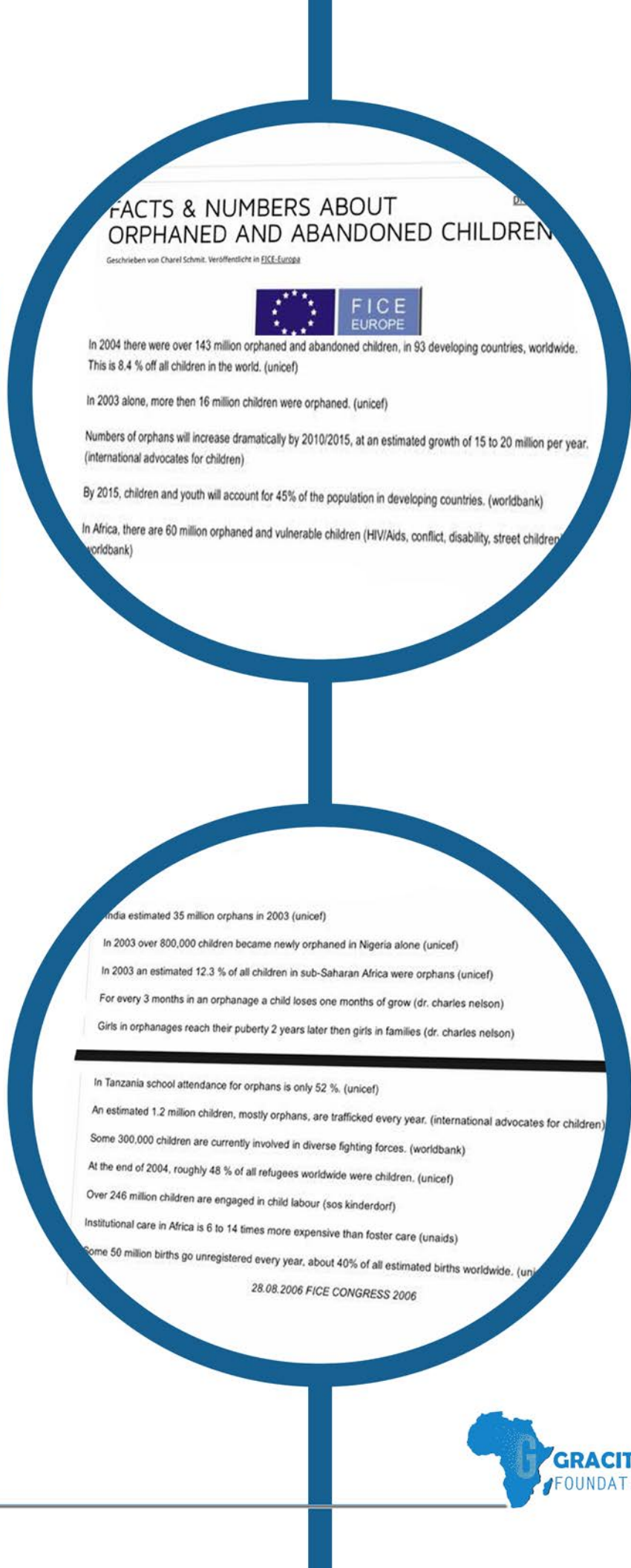

We engage our scholars with tech related events to involve them in the society. By making the orphans participate in the society, they form networks and socialize.



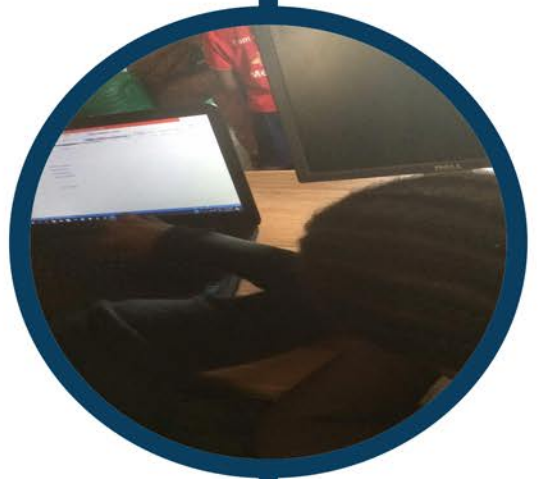

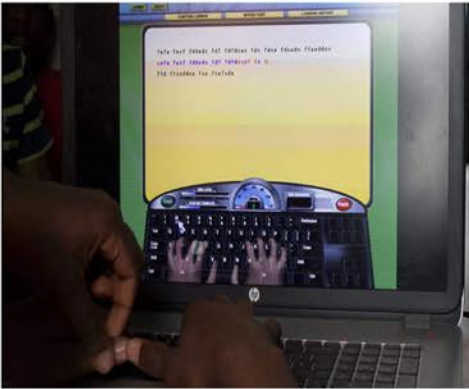

May 2nd: First visit to Ijamido orphanage, Otta, Ogun state

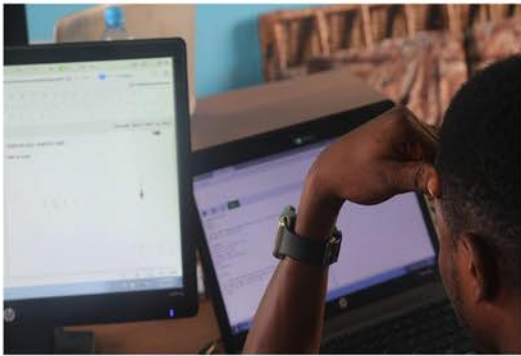
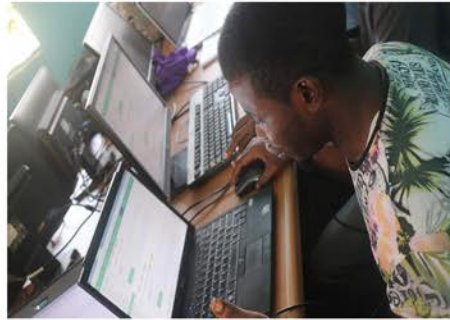
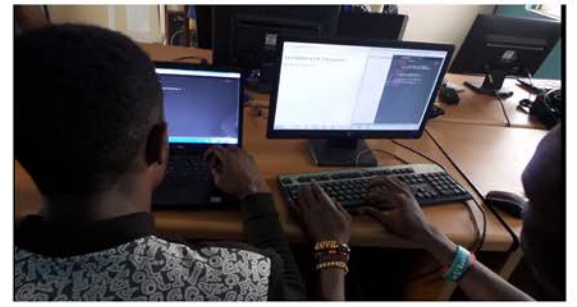


Intense 5 weeks Training at Ijamido to an average of 30 students at different ages and classes

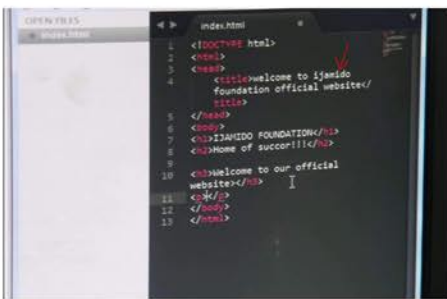
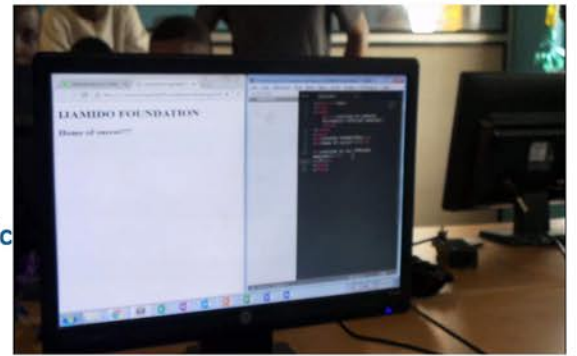


Typing/Basic computer operations /microsoft package class for youger orphans

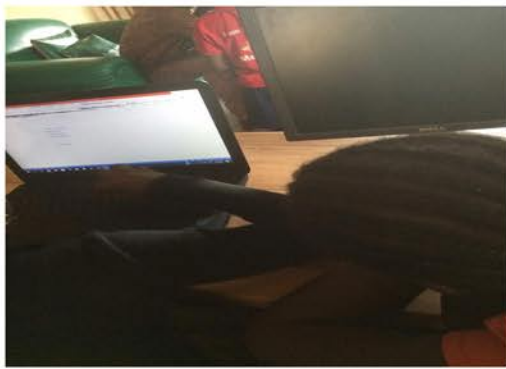




Advance class website design and graphic design for older orphans



Computer introduction and typing lessons at Red Cross Children's home, Makoko, Lagos to 16 young children

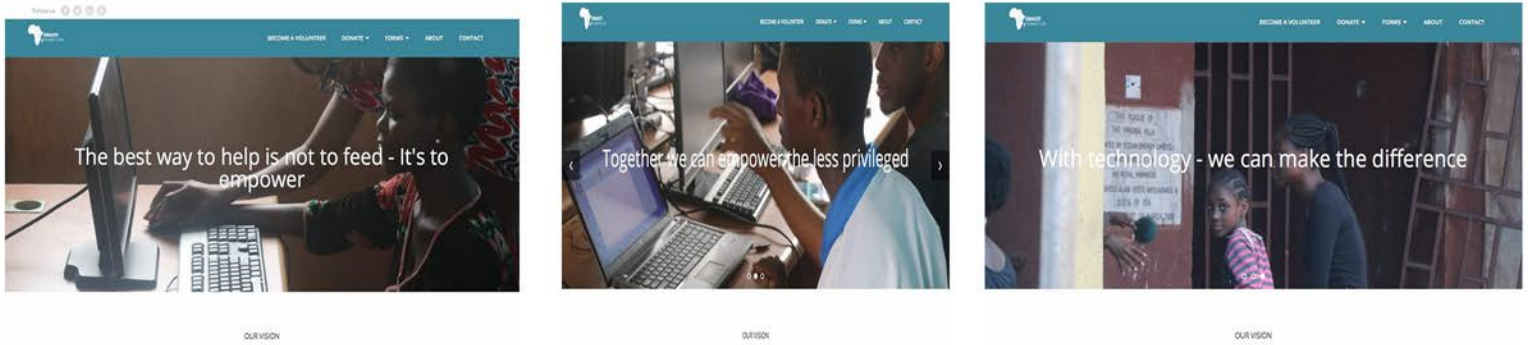

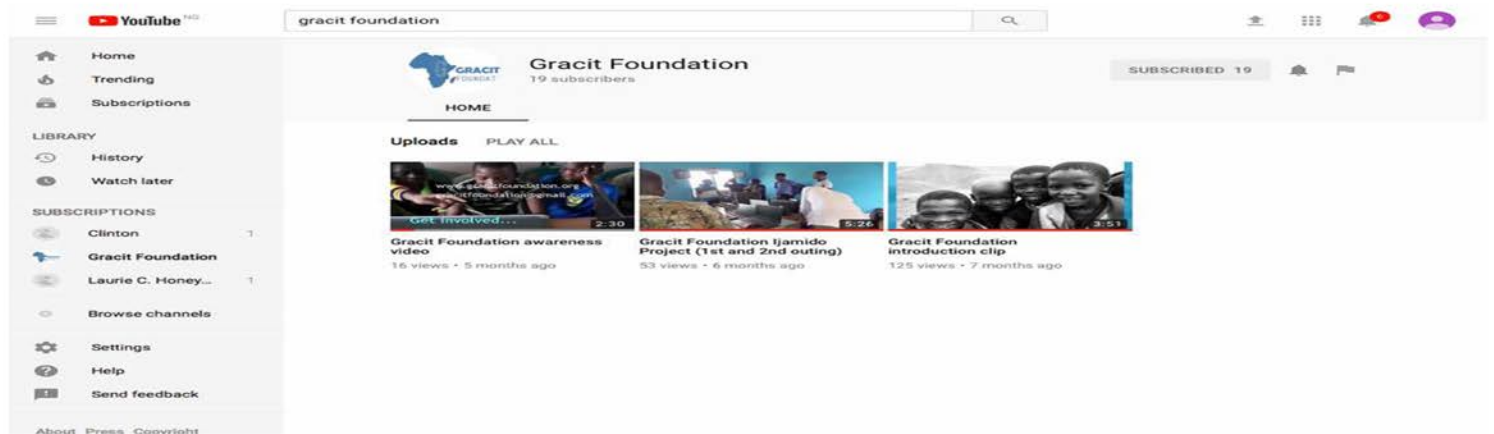




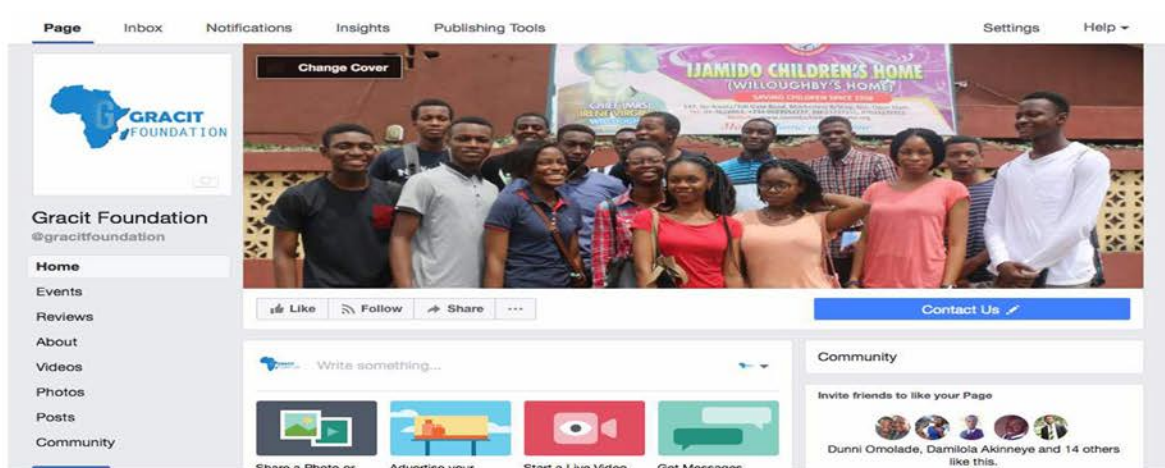
