## The Fur Trade

The IOSF Furget-Me-Not campaign was set up to combat the illegal fur trade, which is the biggest threat to Asian otters – for every tiger skin found there are at least 10 otter skins.

Our Rescue Centre on Skye is renowned worldwide and we provide advice and help for those working in countries like the Democratic Republic of Congo, Ecuador, Philippines and Canada. Our sanctuary on the Isle of Skye provides specialist care for otters from all over Scotland and northern England.

The importance of otters and their role as an ambassador for a healthy environment is spread through education projects in this country and abroad.

Scientific data is vital if we are to direct funding and expertise to where it really matters and make a major contribution to sound conservation strategies.

We share our planet with 13 species of otter and they are all at risk. For some species, such as this Congo clawless (main picture below), there simply isn't enough information on their status. The Hairy-nosed otter (back page) was thought to be extinct in 1998 but a few isolated populations have now been found. Help us to make sure these animals don't disappear for ever.
