The Search Institute has identified these eight core developmental assets as essential building blocks that help young people grow up to be healthy, caring, and responsible youth who are prepared for life and less likely to engage high-risk behaviors.

- 87% of the measured developmental assets are being displayed regularly or more frequently by 87% of our participants.
- 47% our participants demonstrate a leadership role by encouraging their peers to exhibit the same assets, confirming how our sphere of influence extends far beyond the daily participants.
- MEYO has also established a legacy over the past 11 years with 100% of our enrolled youth graduating from high school with post-high school career/education plans.

PEACE PALS



Peace Pals is a program for children grades 1st -5th in the surrounding neighborhood of Divine Redeemer. It centers itself on relationships built with the elementary children who participate. We offer an environment that encourages creativity, focuses on academics and centers itself on friendships, community ties, and child/family support. The program encourages peaceful conflict resolution and provides a safe place for the children to express themselves. Daily programming includes a meal for participants, homework/activity time, and a recreation time.
