




OUR VISION:

58% of PCHP families are non-native English speaking.

A PROVEN BEGINNING FOR SCHOOL SUCCESS SINCE 1965

Under-resourced parents often lack the resources to prepare their children for school and the support to teach their children at home. The Parent-Child Home Program helps eliminate the achievement gap by giving these parents the tools, skills, knowledge, and encouragement to prepare their children for school and life success.

RESEARCH VALIDATED MODEL

- Works with families with children 2-4 years old challenged by poverty, literacy and language barriers, limited education, and isolation.
- Each family receives 92 home visits over the two program years.
- Trained community-based early literacy specialists model reading, play, and conversation activities for parents and children together.
- Families receive at least 46 books and educational toys to build language and literacy-rich homes.
- Curriculum guides provide families with literacy, numeracy, and school readiness activities.

- Families are connected to other needed supports, including housing, medical, and educational services.
- Site staff work with families to ensure every graduate is enrolled in a highquality preschool.
- Professional site coordinators, typically social workers or certified early childhood teachers, provide ongoing training and supervision for early literacy specialists and oversee support and referrals for families.

80% of PCHP families have annual incomes of \$25,000 or less.

The Parent-Child Home Program builds language-rich home environments, increasing positive parent-child interaction, and developing pre-literacy and social-emotional skills that are essential for school readiness.

PCHP PROVEN OUTCOMES



PCHP children are 50% more likely to measure ready for kindergarten than their socio-economic peers.

> Outperformed the statewide average on third grade state math achievement test.



Program graduates scored 2 1/2 times higher on socialemotional skills assessment than the control group.



Enter school performing 10 months above their chronological age.

30% higher graduation rate than their socio-economic peers.



50% less likely to be referred to special education services by the third grade.

84% of Parent-Child Home Program families have not previously had access to quality early childhood services.
