WHO WE ARE

Peer To Peer Uganda (PEERU) is a registered non-profit organization that was founded by a group of young people who passionately volunteered their time to work towards social transformation through reaching out to fellow young people in inadequately served and rural communities of Uganda. Since 2013, PEERU has demonstrated that young people are significant actors in development and can drive positive change at local, community, national and international levels in the areas of Sexual Reproductive Health and Rights, HIV/AIDS awareness and prevention and Harm reduction through strategic partnerships and developing age appropriate awareness campaigns and interventions. Our programs as an organization are based on a holistic bottom up model, focusing on individual leadership change amongst young people as well as systematic change in policy and practice towards a more supportive environment for youth led development. PEERU provides, equips and inspires Adolescents and young people in Uganda between ages of 12 -30 years (12-24, 25-30) in inadequately served communities with high quality, high impact and gender-sensitive Sexual Reproductive Health and Rights information and HIV and AIDS programming through capacity building, specialized service referral, issue-specific advocacy, strategic partnerships and life skills through rights based programming.

WHAT WE DO

Our integrated approach across three health focus areas is implemented in accordance with both the global and national priorities, with special emphasis placed on vulnerable and inadequately served groups of adolescents and youths.



HIV/AIDS

PEERU works with its technical team of young people for the development of HIV behavior change communication interventions. We promote HIV initiatives with a particular focus on adolescents, young men and women of reproductive age, discordant couples and Most at Risk Populations (MARPs). Through use of innovative approaches, PEERU addresses issues of sexuality and gender inequality to encourage responsible and preventative behaviors among youth.

SRHR

Through implementing integrated SRHR and family planning programs, we strive to contribute to improved lives of young people both in and out of school. PEERU builds capacity of service providers through trainings, development of issue specific IEC materials, and promotion of family planning solutions to young women and men of reproductive age. PEERU promotes quality contraceptive methods including condoms to long-term solutions among young people out of school.

HARM REDUCTION

PEERU is at the forefront of communicating and leading youth led advocacy in the change in harm reduction programming with a shift in emphasis from prevention only to the added importance of limited monitored use and rehabilitation. We distribute and conduct interventions around harm reduction among young people and youth.
