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1. REDO'S DESCRIPTION

Rural Environment and Development Organisation(REDO) is local NGO founded in 1999 and since its inception has been working to implement environmental conservation activities in the form of introducing Smart agriculture based on soil conservation, irrigation, tree planting mainly agro forestry as well as fuel energy conservation and advocating for the development of social integration of historically marginalized people in community, through supporting of income generating activities, Bee keeping, pottery and handicraft producers development among others.

The same activities were and some still are implemented around our National Parks and protected area for facilitation of the community needs and rehabilitation of the degraded parches the forest mainly in GISHWATI natural forest, Volcanoes Nation Park and Nyungwe national Park where the situation was worsened by the increased number of Historically Marginalised People HMP.

1.1.REDO's Program

The overall program of REDO is called **TEAMS**:

- Tree planting
- Environment awareness and energy conservation
- Agriculture
- Micro projects (like bee keeping, arts, goats and any other income generating activity)
- Social integration of historically marginalized people

1.2.REDO vision

The vision of REDO is a society where rural Communities living in a secure environment; and empowered to sustainably utilize available resources and opportunities to end poverty and food insecurity

1.3. Mission of REDO:

The mission of REDO is to empower the poor communities especially the Historically Marginalized People to actively participate in improving their livelihood conditions by working towards poverty eradication and improving food security and access to markets that provides poor women and men opportunities for economic and social advancement whilst in parallel instilling on environment protection from grass roots, through a participatory sustainable approach.

1.2. Objectives

- To champion environmental education and public awareness for sustainability in the country and in the great lakes region.
- To instill environmental concerns from grass root to national level
- To work towards poverty eradication through a participatory sustainable approach.
- To integrate Historically Marginalized People(indigenous) into the community

1.5. Values

- **-Team work:** To harness individual talent and ideas for a common Goal, we shall promote team effort, Trust and partnership to achieve our set goals.
- **-Excellence:** Excellent service, client care, image and presentation. We continuously strive to offer a better service today than we did yesterday and aim to exceed beneficiaries' expectation.

1.6. Approaches used by REDO

The above mentioned activities are carried out through a maximum community planning and participatory approach, emphasised and agreed upon in the time of mobilisation and sensitisation efforts by local community leaders in collaboration with REDO.

REDO recognizes that the social and economic problem of the human population have a direct bearing on the wildlife habitat and the social-economic circumstances of the local people.

REDO believes that these issues can be addressed by working together with communities to plan with them, work with them, evaluate with them and ultimately, hand over the project to them.

This also facilitates the success of the conservation technology and the growth of self help initiative in community basis.

1.7. Strategies used

- -Elaborating the project based on the needs prioritised by the beneficiaries in the needs assessment meetings organised by REDO at village level.
- -Consultative meetings with local leaders for discussion and exchange on the project elaborated in term of answering the problem raised by beneficiaries and also for making sure that the project is the District Development Plan (DDP) and performance contract of the District "IMIHIGO".
- -Presenting the project to the donors for funding.
- -Implementing the project in collaboration with local leaders and REDO's technicians at sector and District level.
- -Before implementing the project, the beneficiaries select a committee who will participate actively at every stage of the project. The role of this committee is to collaborate with REDO's social mobilisors, representing the beneficiaries and serve as the linkage between beneficiaries and administrative leaders and donors.
- -Handing over the project to the beneficiaries after the end of funds.

3. Main Achievements

Capacity building of the beekeeping cooperatives, youth trained on making different handicrafts from bamboo sensitization on human right to historically marginalized people and adult literacy are some of the well visible positive results of the organization that contribute to the improved beneficiaries livelihood.

Key objectively verifiable indicators are as follow:

- 1627 Historically marginalized people in Nyamagabe District(Kitabi, Gatare, Uwinkingi and Buruhukiro sectors), Musanze District(Shingiro,Nyange and Kinigi sectors) and in Burera District: gahunga and Cyanika sectors) have been trained in Agriculture system and in increasing their awareness on natural resources by promoting beekeeping enterprises which is an alternative source of incomes and by planting medicinal plants.
- 51 youth in Nyamagabe have been trained on complementary training by making different handicrafts from bamboo as alternative source of income generating activities
- 2628 historically marginalized people completed the training on adult literacy and trained in actively participating in decision-making, governance and local institutions,
- 25 commercially beekeepers cooperatives gathering 1508 members were engaged and supported in honey marketing. In addition the cooperative members of these cooperative groups were also given practical training on improved beekeeping practices
- 25hectors of Bamboo have been planted on waterways around volcanoes national park in Burera District(Gahunga,Rugarama and Cyanika sectors)
- 102 hectors equipped with progress terracing and agro forestry trees
- 134 water tank constructed at household level and schools in Musanze, Burera and Nyabihu Districts.
- 3000Fuel stoves (CANARUMWE) have been distributed around Nyungwe and Cyamudongo forest to reduce fire woods used in house hold and consequently reducing pressure on tree cutting RUSIZI District(NKUNGU,GITAMBI,Nyakabuye and Bweyeye sectors)
- Integrated agro forestry on 35 hectors in Musanze, burera and Nyamagabe District

- 234 goats distributed to the 132 families of historically Marginlised Peoples in Nyamagabe.
- 250 persons have been trained on climate change resilience and adaptation.

2.Interventions analysis

2.1.Coherence

The result of the evaluation showed that the mandate of the REDO is relevant to Rwandan policies and programs of improving the rural development and environment protection.

REDO is coherent to various national plans, strategies, policies and programs. The evaluation of interventions conducted showed that REDO is consistent with and contribute considerably to the District Development Plans DDPs, Nyungwe National Park Strategy NNP, Volcano National Park strategy VNP, Economic Development and Poverty Reduction Strategy of Rwanda EDPRSII and the Vision 2020 to mention but a few.

- REDO is very active in contributing to the achievement of District Development Plans (DDPs) through its participation in improving livelihoods of the Rwandan people in different Districts of the country
- REDO contributes to Park Protection including NNP management plan and VNP
 Management plan through the empowerment of communities living around the National
 parks and protected areas for the conservation and protection of natural resources and
 biodiversity
- REDO is also contributing to EDPRS and vision 2020 through its active participation in
 conserving and preserving natural resources and protection of environment, contribution
 to Human Resource Development through adult literacy of poor marginalized people and
 promoting gender equality through the active involvement of gender participation in all
 its activities

Beside the national policies and programs, REDO is coherent to other various declarations, conventions and international treaties including the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples. REDO support the MDGS through its

fight to eradicate extreme poverty, achieve universal primary education, combating HIV / AIDS, malaria and other diseases, reduce maternal and infant mortality.

Cross-cutting issues are kept into consideration by the organization. Relevant cross-cutting issues that REDO has incorporated into its objectives were the promotion of gender and health, taking into account the active participation of women and girls, the fight against the HIV / AIDS, promotion of family planning, and improving hygiene.

2.2, REDO'S CAPACITY TO IMPLEMENT THIS PROJECT

- -REDO has an experience of more than 15 years , in working with communities especially with historically marginalized people (HMP) in different activities such as environmental awareness, tree planting, fuel stove dissemination, agriculture, beekeeping, literacy based on human rights and land awareness.
- -REDO has 11 permanent staffs qualified in different domains including 6 women; other staff is hired according to the project under implementation.
- -REDO is working with 3000 beneficiaries including 1627 HMPs.
