More than 14,000 cases of child abuse and neglect were reported in Los Angeles County in 2015. A variety of factors contribute to abuse including stressors

related to job instability, a lack of education and poverty. To help break the cycle of abuse, Richstone offers a broad range of programs that heal, educate and support families in need. In 2016-2017, Richstone provided vital services to more than 3.680 children and families.
















The Richstone Family Center is dedicated to treating and preventing child abuse and trauma; strengthening and educating families; and ending violence in families, schools, and communities.

OUR PROGRAMS

Richstone Educating, Assisting, Counseling & Healing (R.B.A.C.H.) is Richstone's core child abuse and domestic violence treament and prevention program. REACH provides individual and family therapy, Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, parenting and anger management classes, home visits, after school programs, a myriad of and educational groups, and special events for children and families. Services are provided in both English and Spanish Spanish to better service our community. (803 individuals served)

Monitored Visitations ensure children can have safe contact with a non-custodial parent without having to be put in the middle of parental conflicts. Monitored visits keep the child safe while supporting the family relationship and parental rights. (49 children and their parents served)

Crisis Team offers crisis intervention,
suicide-related assessments, ongoing counseling and
support groups, parent presentations and staff
trainings at four high schools in the Centinela Valley
Union High School District. (649 students and adults served)



Transitional Living provides stable housing and emotional support to women exiting foster care, helping them obtain and maintain employment, pursue educational goals and save money allowing them to transition to independent living and avoid homelessness. (9 young women served)

Parents As Teachers (PAT) provides voluntary, bi-monthly home visitation services to high-risk mothers and their infants from birth to five years of age. Richstone's parent educators implement the PAT curriculum utilizing age appropriate parent-child interactive and educational activities that help parents keep their child's development on track. (171 children and parents served)

The Everychild Healing Center provides comprehensive trauma focused treatment and wellness programs to both address the needs of children and families in crisis and help them build long-term resiliency. (587 individuals served)



Providence Little Company of Mary, is a partnership program through which Richstone provides individual, family and group therapy at a local community health clinic to promote both physical and mental health in our community. (59 individuals served)

Academic Lifelong Learning (A.L.L.) After-School Program provides support for students, Kindergarten thru 8th grade, through homework help, disguised learning, and enrichment activities giving them skills

they need in order to be stronger leaders in their schools. A key child abuse prevention program, A.L.L. provides opportunities for students and families to learn and play together in a safe and positive environment. (1,366 students served)

Environmental Charter High School (ECHS) provides individual therapy, a stress/anxiety group, and a social skills group for students with special needs. Our goal is to develop, maintain and support a healthy and enricthing environment in which all students and their families can live and succeed. (II student and parents served)
