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TRAINING

South Suburban Community Development Corporation (SSCDC) provides pre-apprentice skills training for at-risk youth, veterans, exfelons, women and the most chronically unemployed. In collaboration with Prairie State, SSCDC has successfully implemented Building Trades Training Programs focused on:

- Drywall and Painting
- Carpentry

Nearly 40% of our students are ex-offenders who join our program because the idea of becoming self-employed offers much better chances for them than finding employers who will hire felons. For others we feel we are creating pathways that redirect individuals from potential regretful mistakes.

SSCDC has tracked positive outcomes for more than 80% of participants:

- Over 50% are employed either in some area of building trades or are selfemployed;
- 15% are employed in areas other than
 the trades;
- 9% are looking for work; and
- Approximately 23% are/have obtained further education



NEW BEGINNINGS

These same students spend the last few weeks of training participating in on-the-job training activities:

- Renovating non-profit facilities
- Providing services to community organizations
- Rehabbing housing units that are then leased to homeless families.



SSCDC and it's L3C organization (HOPE Construction Company) works with local governmental entities to acquire abandoned properties. These properties are then used as training sites for program participants, under the tutelage of master craftsmen, to renovate the properties. To date more than ten units have been rehabbed and occupied by homeless individuals and families.

PARTNERSHIPS

SSCDC has garnered the support of numerous partners and supporters but the work has just begun.

- Prairie State College provides opportunities for the students to obtain a GED and receive additional skills through the college.
- HOPE Construction, an LC3 corporate partner provides housing facilities for training and subsequently leased to homeless families.
- Victory Apostolic Church serves as SSCDC's fisal agent, mentors trainees and serves on the Board of SSCDC.

In addition, we offer Life Skills sessions that include topics such as behavior modification and workplace ethics.
